Plans are already in motion for the 2025 challenge, so stay tuned.

- We are so excited to debut our new mobile outreach van in the new year! This vehicle, purchased with the generous support of FOLMC and an award from the Maryland State Library through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, is guaranteed to make a statement at the many events our staff travels to across the county each week.
