April is National Volunteer Month, and FOLMC thanks the 56 new volunteers and the 198 total volunteers whose time and dedication make a significant difference in the success of our mission to serve Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL). We look forward to celebrating everyone at FOLMC's Volunteer Appreciation Event taking place during National Library Week (April 14-18).

If you've been thinking about getting more involved in your community, now's the perfect time to start. FOLMC invites you to a special Volunteer Open House on April 24 at Rockville Memorial Library where we'll showcase all the ways **you** can support libraries—and fit volunteering into your busy schedule. Why Volunteer Now?

Volunteering is an important way to make your community a better place. It expands your reach and makes a positive impact. Volunteers experience a variety of benefits, from learning new skills to lowering stress levels, achieving shared goals, and meeting friends with like-minded interests.

According to U.S. Census data, the national rate of volunteers declined significantly during the Covid-19 pandemic, which made it challenging for organizations to host events and conduct meetings. While volunteering rates have been on the rebound, there's still a significant gap between pre-pandemic and current levels.

In the Washington, DC region, for instance, 34.1% of people volunteered formally in 2023, compared with just 28.1% nationally. Yet that number is still 5% less than its 2019 high, when nearly 39.5% of people in the DMV volunteered.

Ways to Get Involved

Help "close the gap" with a cause you care about by supporting libraries as a FOLMC volunteer. Support is needed at nearly every level of operations, from organizing shelves at our Branch Booksales to serving on our Board of Trustees.

Booksale volunteers serve at the organization's front lines. They arrange and sort materials and keep bookshelves organized and tidy. Due to the volume of donations received, help is often needed on a daily basis.

You can volunteer as an individual or organize friends to serve together (just make sure to note this when submitting your application). There is no hourly time commitment, but we do ask that you volunteer over a long-term period; yearly preferred.

As a matter of fact, my first job in Montgomery County was as a Volunteer Coordinator.

National Volunteer Month celebrates the long history of volunteers in America, but most importantly, it encourages others to get involved. Mosaic is FOLMC's language arts competition that encourages middle schoolers to express their cultural identity through the written word. Volunteer judges are needed to grade student submissions.

Judges will review one grade level's worth of materials, which is typically a mix of 50 short stories, essays, and poems. The reading period takes place from February - March. Judges are invited to attend the Mosaic Ceremony honoring the winners and honorable mentions.


