Cultivating Our Mission Living Out Our Purpose

FOLMC's mission is to strengthen, promote, and champion Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL) for it to better serve the learning interests and needs of the diverse and changing communities of the County.

Organizations are living organisms, constantly in a state of change. It's important to consider an organization's purpose and core values to be fluid instead of fixed, so that when situations change, the organization can adapt—just like the world around us.

Nonprofit best practices recommend organizations revisit their governing documents, including mission and values, during their strategic planning process every 2-4 years, to make sure their activities support their purpose.

The FOLMC Board of Trustees did just that in August and recommitted to the following purposes as stated in the Articles of Incorporation (which you can read here: https://www.folmc.org/about/):

- To support the public library system in Montgomery County, Maryland
- To encourage gifts, memorials, and endowments for the benefit of library service
- To create opportunities for residents to volunteer their assistance
- To support fundraising efforts for special purposes
- · To sponsor community events and activities
- To assist the library in its public information activities
- To cooperate with the work of the Montgomery County Library Board and the local library advisory committees

In this issue, we'll share a few ways how we live out our purposes through our core programs, fundraising and advocacy efforts in support of MCPL. And while it's our purposes that grow our mission, it's you, our donors, who keep us on the path to achieving it.

Support Fundraising Efforts for Special Purposes – Welcoming Library Kits

A central focus of FOLMC is to support fundraising efforts for special purposes with timely resonance, such as MCPL's new Welcoming Library Kits, demonstrated at right by MCPL Director Anita Vassallo. These are collections of books and



resources that build welcoming communities for immigrants and new Americans. To date we have raised more than \$20,000 to pilot kits at six branches. In keeping with our

A Note from MCPL Director Anita Vassallo



In September 2022, MCPL released its FY23 – FY26 Strategic Plan: Increasing Equity in Access & Opportunity. This Plan defines our core mission, values, and community-centered vision while identifying goal areas that will be the main focus over the next three years.

MCPL will continue to provide its core services for all, while working to achieve the goals in support of the following populations in particular:

- Children 5 and under are ready for kindergarten.
- Teens are ready for college and/or the workforce, and to be lifelong users of the library.
- Speakers of languages other than English can participate fully in American society.
- Residents with limited access to technology and/or the internet can navigate a digital world to get what they need.

To achieve these goals, MCPL will explore launching its strategic priorities at branches located in and around Equity Focus Areas. These are parts of the County that are characterized by high concentrations of lower-income people of color, who may not speak English as their first language. Our Plan targets residents who are susceptible to systemic racial and social inequities. MCPL pledges to work with these and other communities implicated in the Strategic Plan to understand and respond to their needs and interests.

The framework of the plan reflects the needs and desires of the community. MCPL partnered with the Montgomery County Innovation Team to engage community members and MCPL staff in identifying and prioritizing community needs for its strategic framework. Community members and staff shared their feedback through postcards, vision boards, focus groups, and an online survey. Many of you participated in this process, and we are grateful for your time and invaluable feedback.
