
MCPL is strategically moving forward!

On January 30, 2016, County Executive Isiah Leggett officially reopened the Twinbrook branch of Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL). The branch closed in July 2015 to undergo a refresh, the first under the County Executive's Library Refurbishment Level of Effort Project.

The refresh project model provides a structured process to ensure that library services stay current, and the buildings' infrastructures remain safe and efficient. Work within the projects may include carpeting, painting, reorganizing interior layouts to create more useable space, updating restrooms, upgrading lighting to more energy efficient fixtures, and replacing worn and unusable furniture. Also included is the implementation of service and programming updates based on branch demographics and the evolving roles of libraries such as single service desks, computer labs, digital media labs, collaboration spaces, and emergent literacy areas.

With this new approach, we will complete refurbishments on 17 libraries during the six year Capital Improvements Program period. The refresh of the Kensington Park branch is nearing completion, and work is progressing with the designs for the refresh of Aspen Hill, Davis, and Little Falls branches.

I welcome you to stop by and check out the newly refreshed Twinbrook branch, and keep up to date on all refresh projects via our website (www.montgomerycountymd.gov/library).
