# Wishing Anita Vassallo the Best in Her Next Chapter

From the desk of Ari Z. Brooks, Executive Director, FOLMC



We congratulate our friend, MCPL Library Director Anita Vassallo, as she closes one big chapter in her life—and begins another.

In June, Vassallo will retire from her 55-year career in the MCPL system, which began simply with a

love of books. As a child, she spent a great deal of time at the Four Corners Library in Woodmoor and got her first job there as a teenager, shelving books. After Vassallo received her master's in library science from the University of Maryland, she became a Children's Librarian at the Kensington Park Library. She also worked at three other branches, before becoming Library Manager at Davis Library, and held a position in MCPL's technology and website management division, experience that she would use as Library Director to help MCPL keep pace with changing times. For instance, MCPL now offers video streaming services and online classes, and many of the branches have undergone refresh projects that upgraded their technology.

We are particularly grateful for Vassallo's role in establishing a Teen Librarian in all MCPL branches. I remember how groundbreaking it was when MCPL hired its first Young Adult librarian back in early 2000s. The importance of Teen Librarians cannot be overstated, as they connect teens with library resources during a critical time in their lives—and serve as a significant adult for many young people. Through Vassallo's leadership, teens are now a critical population for MCPL core services, and a dedicated Teen Services Manager, librarian Tyler Chadwell-English, oversees all teen programming. Helping teens get ready for college and the workforce, as well as become lifelong users of the library are a big part of MCPL's strategic priorities.

FOLMC exists to meet the needs of MCPL; we are here to serve them. We are proud of the work we have done to support teens. from launching the Mosaic Creative Writing Program as a way for middle schoolers to showcase their creative writing talents and re-unite them with library resources to outfitting the first "teen space" in the Wheaton Library through signage and ergonomic furniture. Every MCPL branch now has a dedicated teen space at certain hours of the day, usually after school. FOLMC is grateful to the contributions of our high school Student Representatives on the Board of Trustees for helping FOLMC determine the programs and enhancements that best serve the teen population in Montgomery County. FOLMC also provides funding for MCPL's Teen Advisory Boards so they can enjoy pizza while they conduct business, and we're especially proud of the "Keep Calm & Go to the Library" panel discussion on mental health resources we collaborated together on in 2022 which featured national teen mental health advocates.

Vassallo may be retiring, but these innovations will have an everlasting impact. We thank her for her decades of service and wish her the very best on her next adventure.

### A Note from MCPL Director Anita Vassallo



We are so excited to continue MCPL's greener, community-driven Summer Reading Challenge (SRC). This model was proposed by our former Early Literacy and Children's Programming Manager Cassandra Malik to align with the county's Climate Action Plan, which emphasizes lessening our footprint through the reduction of waste. Implemented in 2022, MCPL's redesigned summer reading program encouraged young residents to give back to the community while reading, learning, playing and socializing. Participants were no longer awarded with small, non-biodegradable plastic prizes, but with the satisfaction and pride of having made a significant improvement in the community.

This summer's "Adventure Starts Here" challenge spotlights local historic sites and recreation areas, as we again partner with Montgomery Parks Foundation. The Foundation will use the generous donations from FOLMC for three new objectives; by reading and completing activities, children and teens will be helping to conserve, beautify, and expand accessibility in parks throughout Montgomery County.

Over the past few years, we have seen a significant increase in numbers of SRC participants - nearly 13,000 in 2022 and over 14,000 in 2023. Our greener, community-driven model has gained local and national attention. The success of our summer reading program is largely due to the support of FOLMC, for which we are extremely grateful. Working together, we look forward to even more participants this year who will positively impact our community through reading.
